PLAYGROUND: Call for Collaborations 2025 by Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Contemporary Ensemble

PROJECT REGULATIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

- **1.1.** This document governs the conduct of the project called PLAYGROUND: Call for collaborations (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"), organized by the ensemble Spółdzielnia Muzyczna contemporary ensemble (hereinafter referred to as the "Ensemble" or the "Organizer").
- **1.2.** The Project is aimed at young composers of all genders from around the world who are permanent residents of European Union countries and were born no earlier than January 1, 1990.
- **1.3.** Only unpublished works that have never been performed publicly, and that meet the requirements specified in Section 3 of the Regulations ("Concept Note, Instrumentation, Software, and Equipment"), will be accepted for the Project.
- 1.4. The Project consists of three stages, referred to as "Stage II," "Stage II," and "Stage III."
- **1.5.** Participation in the Project requires the applicant (hereinafter referred to as the "Candidate") to pay a non-refundable entry fee of 100 PLN for Candidates residing in Poland or the equivalent in EUR for Candidates residing outside Poland, by bank transfer to the following account:

1.6. The Project is co-financed by the City of Krakow and by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland under the "Public Diplomacy 2024 - 2025 - European Dimension and Countering Disinformation".

2. PROJECT PROCEDURE

2.1. Stage I — Application Submission

- **2.1.1.** During Stage I, the Candidate must submit the following materials (collectively referred to as the "Application") to the Ensemble by e-mail at ensemble@spoldzielniamuzyczna.com in the form of a message titled "PLAYGROUND [Candidate's Name]" containing a non-expiring link to a ZIP or RAR archive uploaded to a file-sharing service such as Dropbox:
- (a) A PDF file containing the following information about the Candidate:
- full name;
- mailing address;
- mobile phone number and e-mail address;
- a biographical note (up to 3,000 characters).
- (b) Recordings of two different chamber compositions by the Candidate, created within the last four
- (4) years and completed no earlier than January 1, 2021, in WAV, MP3, MP4, or MOV format; solo or orchestral works will not be considered.

- (c) A video recording in MP4 or MOV format, approximately two (2) minutes long, featuring a self-presentation by the Candidate and the presentation of the concept of collaboration, including answers to the following questions:
- Why do you want to participate in the PLAYGROUND: Call for Collaborations organized by Sp ółdzielnia Muzyczna Contemporary Ensemble?
- What do you expect from this project? What interests you the most?
- (d) A PDF file containing a description of the concept of the piece and collaboration submitted to the Project by the Candidate, not exceeding 1,500 characters including spaces.
- (e) Proof of payment of the entry fee in the form of a PDF file.
- (f) A high-resolution portrait photograph of the Candidate in JPEG, JPG, or TIFF format.
- 2.1.2. The deadline for submitting Applications is December 15, 2024 (CET 23:59:59).
- **2.2.** The central theme of the 2025 edition is COLLABORATION, understood primarily as the cooperation between the composer and the instrumentalists, the integration of the creative process, and the emphasis on the workshop aspect during the Project's implementation.
- **2.3.** Based on the Applications, the members of the Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Contemporary Ensemble will initially select eight (8) finalists from among the Candidates. Subsequently, after conducting online interviews with each of them, three (3) composers will be chosen to proceed to Stages II and III (hereinafter referred to as the "Participants"). This stage will be completed by January 10, 2025.
- **2.3.1.** The list of Participants will be announced on the Ensemble's website (spoldzielniamuzyczna.com) and on its social media (Facebook, Instagram).
- **2.4.** Stage II Consultations
- **2.4.1.** During Stage II, the Participant will present the concept and agree on the instrumentation to be used in the Project with the Ensemble, and must conduct mandatory individual online consultations with each performer necessary for the realization of the concept between January 15 and January 31, 2025. The individual consultations will be scheduled on a working basis between the Participant and the Ensemble's musicians.

2.5. Stage III

In Stage III, the Participant will work with the instrumentalists on the piece at the Ensemble headquarters at ul. Kopernika 19, 31-529 Krakow, where the collective concept of the "Piece" will be developed. The collaboration will take place in the first half of March 2025.

- **2.5.2.** After the workshops, the Participant and members of the Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Contemporary Ensemble will agree on the form and degree of definition of the Piece's score needed for subsequent concert performances.
- **2.5.3.** Between March and July 2025, there will be five (5) concerts featuring the PLAYGROUND repertoire: in Krakow (Poland), Tallinn (Estonia), Stockholm (Sweden), Prague (Czech Republic), and Plascencia (Spain).
- **2.5.4.** Regarding the Workshops and Concert, the Participants are entitled to:
- (a) accommodation during the conceptual work and concert performance in Krakow for seven (7) nights.
- (b) reimbursement of travel expenses, up to 500 EUR.
- (c) a professional audio-video recording of the Piece during the Concert.

3. INSTRUMENTATION, SOFTWARE, AND EQUIPMENT

3.1.	The	Piece	may	be	written	for	any	combination	of	instruments	(minimum	quintet)	from	the
foll	owing	g list:												

— flute (bass / alto / grande / piccolo);
— clarinet (bass / in B / in A / in E-flat);
- saxophone (baritone / tenor / alto / soprano);
— violin;
— violin/viola;
— cello;
— piano;

— percussion (as per Section 3.1.1 below).

3.1.1. Percussion instrumentation:

The scope of the percussion instruments will be agreed directly with the percussionist during the preparatory process (after the Participant is selected for the project). This scope may include percussion instruments, objects, MIDI controllers, and a computer (MacBook Pro M1 Pro with Ableton LIVE).

- **3.2.** It is also possible to use electronics and equipment as specified in Sections 3.2.1 and 3.2.2 below. The Participant must provide a performance-ready software project and bring all necessary devices and software to the Rehearsals and Concert that cannot be replaced by the provided equipment.
- **3.2.1.** The following software is permitted:
- Ableton Live 10 / 11 Suite;
- Reaper;
- Max/MSP 7 / 8.
- **3.2.2.** The Ensemble can provide the following equipment for rehearsals and concerts:
- mixer (digital: Behringer X18);
- audio interface (Focusrite Scarlett 18i6 / 2 \times Focusrite Scarlett 4i4);
- 3 x MIDI keyboards (25 keys);
- laptop (MacBook Pro / Dell Precision M5570);
- two (2) speakers.
- **3.2.3** Use of a video layer in the piece is not permitted.

4. COPYRIGHT AND LICENSE

- **4.1** Submitting the Application—along with the Sketch and the Work, if applicable (collectively referred to as the "Work")—is equivalent to the Candidate (and subsequently the Participant):
- (a) consenting to the Organizer's use of the Participant's image and full name for promotional and advertising purposes;

- (b) declaring and guaranteeing that they are the sole author of the submitted Work, hold full proprietary and personal copyright over the Work, and have the full rights to dispose of the Work within the scope specified in the Regulations.
- **4.2** The Participant grants the Organizer a royalty-free license to use the Work across all fields of exploitation, including in particular:
- (a) recording and reproducing the Work using any technology—in any system, format, and on any medium—including print, photographic film, magnetic tape, CD, DVD, Blu-ray, and digitally;
- (b) placing the Work on the market.
- (c) entering the Work into computer memory, computer networks, and/or multimedia databases.
- (d) providing public access to the Work in such a way that anyone can access it at a place and time of their choosing—for example, making it available on the internet, on any websites, or in any paid or free services accessible through downloading, streaming, and any other technology—and within any telecommunications services, using any systems and devices, including mobile phones, desktop and/or mobile computers, as well as transfers using any available technologies, such as GSM, UMTS, etc., as well as through telecommunication networks.
- (e) public performance and public display.
- (f) analog and digital broadcasting and/or rebroadcasting of the image and/or sound—encoded or unencoded, paid or unpaid, in any system, format, or technology, wired or wireless—via terrestrial stations, satellite, including through digital platforms, cable networks, telecommunications links, mobile television, any computer network (including the internet), etc.
- **4.3** The Organizer grants an open license to the Participant for the publication, release, and sharing of performance materials, provided the Organizer is informed in advance. If the Work is performed by another ensemble, the performance and promotional materials must include the following note:

"This work was realized within the framework of the Playground: call for collaborations 2025 program in collaboration with the Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Contemporary Ensemble."

5. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

Pursuant to Article 13(1 - 2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter referred to as "GDPR"), we inform that:

- **5.1** The personal data administrator collected in connection with the Project is the Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Association, Kopernika Street 19, 31-529 Krakow.
- **5.2** The data of Candidates and subsequently Participants in the Project will be processed solely for purposes and within the scope necessary for conducting the Project, that is, for the identification of Candidates and for determining and potentially publicly disclosing the names of Project Participants, including on the Organizer's websites.
- **5.3** The Organizer will store personal data in compliance with applicable regulations, including securing them against access by unauthorized persons, unauthorized collection, unlawful processing, and against alteration, loss, damage, or destruction.

- **5.4** Recipients of the provided personal data are suppliers of goods and services necessary for achieving the objectives, as well as entities authorized under the provisions of law, including state authorities.
- **5.5** The personal data of the Candidate and subsequently the Participant will be stored until they withdraw their consent.
- **5.6** The Candidate and subsequently the Participant have the right to access their personal data and to rectify them and have the right to submit a written request for cessation of data processing. All correspondence regarding the processing of personal data should be directed to the Organizer at the following address: Spółdzielnia Muzyczna Association, Kopernika Street 19, 31-529 Krakow.
- **5.7** Providing data is voluntary, but failure to do so will make it impossible to apply for participation in the Project. The legal basis for processing personal data is Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR.

6. FINAL PROVISIONS

- **6.1** Participation in the Project is tantamount to acceptance of the Regulations.
- **6.2** The Regulations are the only document defining the rules of the Project.
- **6.3** Applications not meeting the requirements of the Regulations will not be admitted to the Project, with the Organizer ensuring that information about disqualified Candidates will not be disclosed publicly, and that submitted works will not be used in any way by the Organizer.
- **6.4** The Organizer is not responsible for issues related to the inability to contact Project Participants.
- **6.5** For significant reasons, the Project may be canceled by the Organizer.
- **6.6** The Organizer reserves the right to make binding interpretations of the provisions of the Regulations.
- **6.7** In matters concerning the Project and not provided for in these Regulations, the Organizer has the deciding voice.
- **6.8** The Organizer reserves the right to introduce changes to the content of the Regulations.
- **6.9** These Regulations are available in both Polish and English on the Organizer's website: spoldzielniamuzyczna.com. The Polish version is the basis for interpretation.
